\*\* SCOTLAND BECOMES FULL MEMBER OF ICCF \*\*

After many years of endeavour, Scotland secured full membership of ICCF at this year's Congress in Järvenpää, Finland. Our country now has equivalent rights to the Scottish Chess Association, which has been a member of FIDE since 1932 for over-the-board chess. The voting was almost unanimously in favour, with only 4 abstentions. The support of the ICCF President, Henk Mostert, and of the BPCF Delegate, Reg Gillman was very important and they deserve a special vote of thanks from the Scottish CCA and its members. Another piece of excellent news is that Scotland is now very likely to achieve a place in the next Olympiad CC Final, which would be a tremendous achievement, at only our second attempt.

It is hoped that Scottish CCA members will respond by showing even greater interest in international correspondence chess by participating in ICCF events as well as our own national tournaments. Details are available from Phil Giuliani, Colin Macgregor, George Livie or myself, but our December magazine will include a special feature on all international activities.

**OBITUARY - TOM MASON**

It was with regret that we learned of the death, earlier this year, of one of the Association's members - Tom Mason. Born on 10th February 1910 in Motherwell, Tom played most of his chess in and around the Glasgow area.

He played over-the-board chess with Greenock at Rankin Park and after moving back to Glasgow some 4 years ago he joined another local club until last year when failing eyesight forced him to give up. He was a long time member of the SCCA and continued to play up to his death - having qualified for the Quartet finals.

Tom will be sorely missed both by his surviving family and by all the friends he made on the chess scene in Scotland.

**ICCF CONGRESS - 1991**  
Järvenpää, Finland

The Congress was held in the Hotel Rivoli, Järvenpää, Finland from 20th to 28th July 1991 and organised by the Finnish Correspondence Chess Federation. Järvenpää is approx 30 miles from Helsinki and located at the northern end of Lake Tuusulanjärvi. I was able to attend for all of the meetings and also enjoy an evening in Helsinki and a tour of the artists community around the Lake. It was very interesting to visit the houses of Jean Sibelius, the most famous Finnish composer, and the artist Pekka Halonen. Later in the week, the delegates were due to visit Turku, Finland's oldest town and birthplace of Paavo Nurmi, the famous Olympic long-distance runner.

The Congress was opened by ICCF President, Henk Mostert (Netherlands), who welcomed the 45 delegates from 22 different countries. It was particularly pleasing to have delegates from Qatar attending for the first time.

After thanking the host Federation for the excellent programme and arrangements for the second ICCF meeting to be held in Järvenpää (previously in 1979), the President expressed sincere thanks to those Vice-Presidents not standing for re-election. He referred to the service given to ICCF over very many years by Messrs. C.G. Dieta (Argentina), E. Larsson (Sweden), H. Rittner (East Germany) and Dr. J. Vándorffy (Hungary). However, he was pleased to report that capable successors had already been identified and some of them had already begun working on their respective duties.

The General Secretary, Paul Diaconescu (Romania), proposed ICCF Honorary Membership for Raimo Lindroos (Finland) and Dr. Jozsef Vándorffy (Hungary) and this was approved with acclamation. The CC Federation of Qatar was accepted into full membership and it was also agreed to grant membership to CAPA, without voting or nomination rights, as a second association for Argentina.

Bertl von Massow medals were then presented for meritorious service in Gold (15 years) to J.A. Nielsen (Denmark), and in Silver (10 years) to A.P. Borwell (Scotland), H. Glaser (Singapore), L. Lahdenmäki (Finland), G.W.G. Livie (Scotland), M. Samraoui (Algeria) and S. Sergiev (Bulgaria)

The Tournament Director, Ragnar Wikman (Finland) reported that the top places in World Championship Final XII had been decided with the winner G.K. Sanakoev (SU) followed by J. Franzen (Czechoslovakia) and R. Kauranen (Finland). The new World Cups XIII/IX had started with 2343 players in 213 sections. Only 14 teams had entered the preliminary groups of the Ladies CC Olympiad V.

Postal difficulties had arisen with parts of the Soviet Union and efforts were being made to try to achieve improvement. Serious problems existed with the transmission of moves with Cuba and unless this improved, no Cuban players would be accepted in ICCF tournaments from 1/1/93.

A new Tournament Commission would be created to review all existing ICCF tournaments and consider future developments.

The report of the World Tournament Bureau showed that 1566 players had started in 182 sections during 1990 and another 532 players had entered Thematic Tournaments. Three new Abonyi Tournaments had begun but separate Ladies Sections had been abandoned due to lack of sufficient entries.

The report of the European Tournament Bureau showed that 1852 players from 31 different countries had started in 1990, which was a significant decrease probably affected by the new World Cup Tournament and the economic situation in Eastern European countries. Nol van 't Riet (NL) had handed over his duties to E. Lüers of Germany and it was reported that this change had not seriously delayed the work of the Bureau. Appeals in tournaments covered by this bureau would be dealt with by E. Kotzem (D).

Reports of the North American, Latin American and Anglo-Pacific Tournament Bureaux indicated good progress and no particular problems.

The Liaison Officer to FIDE, S. Kania (Poland), had been unable to undertake any work during the year and had intimated that he could not continue in this office.

In my Treasurer's Report, I presented accounts for the years 1989 and 1990, which showed an acceptable financial situation. The political developments in Eastern Europe had resulted in a considerable devaluation of ICCF funds held in these countries but this had been compensated by the fees derived from the new World Cup Tournaments. Although no increase in fees was recommended, I reserved the right to propose increases should there be a deterioration in the financial position of ICCF in the next year or two. It was emphasised that all countries which did not pay their fees promptly (ie. before 31st March of the following year) would be recommended for immediate exclusion from new ICCF events.

The Auditor had been unable to complete his audit but he would be asked to do this before 31/12/91.

There were meetings of the Qualifications and Rules Committees under their new Chairmen, A.A. van 't Riet (Netherlands) and R. Gillman (GB) respectively. Some specific matters were agreed and are reported later under "Title Awards", "Tournament Arrangements" and "Matters pertaining to the Rules" but it was agreed that all other points should be considered by the newly structured committees during the next year.

The Telechess Committee report indicated that first place in the 3rd Tele-Chess Olympiad had been awarded to Australia because the final against DDR could not be played due to the political changes in Germany. A circular letter would be sent to federations about experimental telefax tournaments.

The report of the Documentation Committee referred to the growing archives of ICCF, although much more information was being sought about national CC magazines and biographical data from member federations. It was agreed to review the possibility of ICCF having its own journal(s) and a small group (including the Editor of Fernschach) would be formed to consider all possibilities.



A new Correspondence Chess Year Book had been launched in Italy and contact would be made to explore possible closer co-operation between ICCF and the Editor of the new publication.

From 1992, the ISO code as used by FIDE will be adopted by ICCF and used in all future communications and publications.

The Ratings Commissioner reported that the new ICCF Rating List contained 3845 players, of which 2763 had fixed ratings. The Ladies List had 127 players, with 78 having fixed ratings. The results of 1325 tournaments and national championships were included, and 71 friendly matches and 328 World Cup sections had been incorporated. The Expert Group were considering the possibilities for the extension of the list to include results from Higher Class tournaments etc, which would probably lead to a lowering of the current published minimum rating of 2000.

The following Committee changes were agreed:

**Qualifications:** H. Rittner (D) retired.

**Rules:** J. Bodis (F) appointed. A. Giraudet (F) and H. Rittner (D) retired.

**Documentation:** A.M. Anderson (GB) and Dr. L. Frey (PL) appointed.

Under **Matters pertaining to the Statutes** the following significant changes were agreed:

    - 1) the appropriate national federation is in agreement with the memberships, and
    - 2) the countries concerned are members of FIDE.
  - c) the members of the Group of Sponsors
  - d) honorary members."

\*8 The Congress shall meet at least every other year."

The President advised that translations of ICCF Rules had been made in Spanish and Arabic. He also informed that the Committee for updating the ICCF Statutes consists of A P Borwell (Scotland), I Diani (Argentina), L Lahdenmäki (Finland), H J Mostert and A.A. van 't Riet (Netherlands) and U. Wagner (Germany). This Committee had already begun its work on proposals and a unanimous draft would be sent to all members of the Presidium for approval and submission thereafter to the Congress.

Under **Matters pertaining to the Rules of Play**, paragraph 22 was changed to read:

"Those countries which have met their financial commitments are entitled to take part with one team each."

Under **Matters pertaining to the Tournament Rules**, an addition was made to paragraph 5:

"A player who fails to respond to an accepted conditional move shall be penalised with an additional 5 days time of reflection. See also paragraph 16."  
(This amendment applies only to tournaments which start after the publication of the ICCF Minutes in Fernschach).

(This referred particularly to the next Men's Olympiads.)

No. 34 of the mag featured MarGerz. Brace yourself for the second leg, in which Black gets what is known in the trade as What He Deserves. *Stephan's comments are in italics, mine in normal print.*

**White:** Stephan Gerzadowicz  
**Black:** Ian Marks

1 g3!

**MARKS:** Tartakower once called 1 c4 "the strongest opening move of all." I think 1 g3 runs it pretty close. Why? OK, you reply in fine classical style with 1 ... e5 and White goes 2 c4. Do you defend against the English with 1 ... e5? No? Then you've been conned. Or you reply 1 ... d5 and find yourself on the wrong side of a Catalan if White decides to flick in d4 and c4. And if you're an Indian fan, you've got problems. And so on. Plus all your prepared theory goes out the window. Hence the !

Before we get on with Gerz-Marks, let's philosophise a little and consider whether 1 Nf3 might be a better introduction to these fianchetto set-ups. The pundits tell us that, since it prevents 1 ... e5, 1 Nf3 is the better move. But does it? Let's see. 1 g3 e5 2 Bg2 d5 3 d3 c6 4 Nf3 Nd7 and 1 Nf3 d5 2 g3 c6 3 Bg2 Nd7 4 d3 e5 both give the same position, a fairly solid Caro-Kann type set-up for Black. Of course, there are other possibilities; it's basically a matter of taste. You pays your money...

And is this the longest note for move 1...?

Heading towards a Closed Sicilian; OK for Black, of course, but a line I never feel that comfy with. Not that Stephan knew THAT.



4 ..... Nf6?

Sloppy and routine. Since ... c5 (probably) figures in Black's plans, it would've made more sense to aim for a set-up with ... c5/Nc6/e6 and Nge7, which gives a smoother development and allows Black to stymie White's Kingside attack with a timely ... f5. Maybe Black isn't lost after 4 ... Nf6, but he's going to have a more difficult middle game to play.

GERZ: In a Closed Sicilian, which is what we're heading for, I've had more trouble vs ... e6 and ... Nge7. With that flexible set-up Black can meet a Kingside Pawn storm with a timely ... f5, which always stops me in my tracks.

5 Nb3

A shared regard for Duncan Suttles is what brought Ian and me together, so I played a Duncanesque move in both of our initial two games.

The books are so busy telling us to put our KN on f3 that they don't tell us that a Nf2, in conjunction with a Bg2, is a formidable weapon for both offence and defence. Why do these positions never make the books?

5 ..... 0-0  
6 0-0 c5

Anything else make positional sense?

7 e4 Nc6  
8 Nf2

I wasn't sure where my Queen Knight was going, but Nf2 is part of The Plan. In a Closed Sicilian lacking Suttlety, White often plays Nh4 and tries for f5. But what then? If Black can't be induced to play ... h6, g6 is adequately defended. So what does the Knight do? White might try g5, f6. Double-edged! That takes time, while Black has the use of the key e5 square and will work for ... d5. And the Knight on h4?

Ah, but from f2! White plans g5 and Ng4, striking at the squares Black weakened on move one. And White can still play for f5 when Ng4 contests e5. And, if Black gets in ... d5, White might even use e5!

Chess is easy.

8 ..... Bd7

8 ... Rb8!?!; 8 ... Qc7!?!; 8 ... Nd7!?

Need I mention that Nf2 stops ... Bg4?

9 Nd2

So, not quite a Closed Sicilian.

If 9 Nc3 we have a classic Closed Sicilian position with Nf2 instead of Nf3. It would have taken an extra move to achieve that, uh, more aggressive Knight posting. Surely a small price.

But I decided to try for Nd2-c4-e3. From there the Knight will support f5 and deter ... d5.

Had he stopped this with 9 ... b5 the Knight would likely have gone to f3, probably after g5. I've had Knights on f2 and f3 before, but always the King's Knight on f3. If all the other pieces found their same squares, would we have the same opening? Think about that while the players hurry about their business.

9 ..... Rb8  
10 Nc4 b5  
11 Ne3 b4

Rancy a square?

12 g4

No thanks. And since Black doesn't have ... f5 available, the move gains in strength. If Black can react to g4 with ... f5, he's usually pretty safe. An OTB game of mine (Marks-Taylor, Glasgow Open 1972) went 1 g3 c5 2 Bg2 Nc6 3 Nc3! g6 4 d3 Bg7 5 f4 e6! 6 e4 Nge7 7 Nf3 0-0 8 0-0 d6 9 g4!? Rb8 10 Kh1 b5 11 f5!? and 1-0 in 32, but if Black had tried 9 ... f5 .....

12 ..... a5

The original patzer's ploy: when in doubt, shove up the Pawn nearest your hand. How about 12 ... Ne8!? at once?

13 g5 Ne8  
14 Rb1

Is this necessary? I feared ... a3. And I wanted my Queen's Bishop free for either f5 (Bf4!?) or c3 (with Bd2).

Given what happens, perhaps 14 f5!? I don't like it. It gives up e5. But White must improve on the game somewhere to justify the Nf2, Ne3 set-up.

Maybe chess isn't so easy.

14 ..... e6

Is this necessary? ... Nb5 and a3 would be an amusing reflection of what I'm plotting on the other wing.

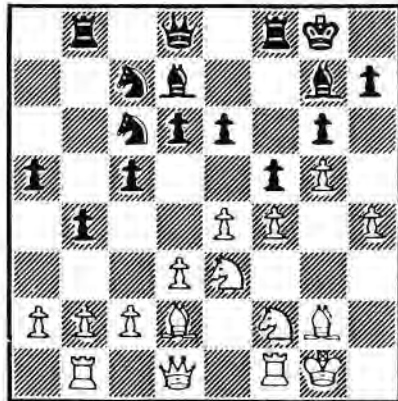
Perhaps we both feared the other's ideas too much?

OK, I confess - I couldn't come up with A Decent Plan. But whatever, the Pawn was better on e7. From here on in, the game is a smooth and unhurried strangulation.

15 Bd2 Nc7  
16 h4

Played to support g5 so's to play f5. Black stops that.

16 ..... f5



Too late, too late.

Now should I open it up? 17 gxf6 Bxf6 18 h5 Qe8 seemed as good for him as for me. His King will be safe on h8, and he can rush troops to the Kingside as quickly as I can.

Better to maintain my space advantage. Then I have more room to mass the forces, before opening things up. That's the theory of utilising a space advantage, anyway...

But then, what of Ne3 and Nf2? Must White admit to having a less than perfect idea?

"Faced with having to change our views or prove that there is no need to do so, most of us get busy on the proof."

John Kenneth Galbraith

Ne3 and Nf2 are so well posted, you see, that Black was driven to the desperate ... f5, weakening g6 and the long white diagonal to g8.

You see?

Having accomplished (all) that, the White Knights are now free for other adventures. (A small voice asks, "But where will the Knight on f2 ever go?")

17 h5 Nb5

Possibly a small error. That a2-g8 line has been weakened, and this guy was watching part of that. Better might be 17 ... Re8 or 17 ... Nd4.

18 exf5!

Alert.

18 ..... gxf5

He can't take with the e-pawn, so I get a potent pair of Pawns on g5 and h5. But how best to mass the troops behind them? And will Black be able to break in the centre?

Forced, since the otherwise desirable 18 ... exf5 runs up against 19 Bd5+ Kh8 20 hxg6 hxg6 21 Qf3 +-. Why didn't I see this? Don't know. I just didn't. Maybe something interesting on the telly while I was studying the position. There's some consolation in the way the Black Pawns cradle the centre, but those dudes on the g and h-files look pretty mean...

19 Qe1 Qe8

19 ... Nbd4 would stop my effective manoeuvre Bd1. It is important to use the Knight on b5 so to clear the b-file. That way

I couldn't kick him off d4 - 19 ... Nbd4 20 c3? bxc3 21 bxc3 Rxb1 22 Qxb1 Ne2+ 23 Kh2 Nxf4 (or ... Nxc3).

20 Bf3! Ncd4  
21 Bd1

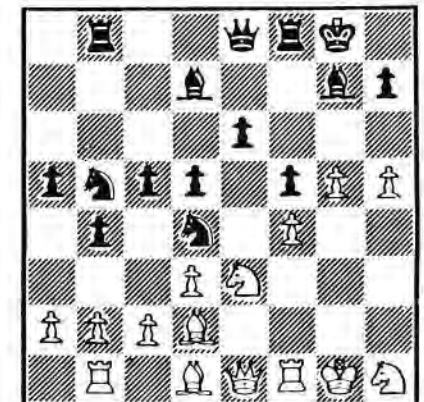
Falling back to an aggressive post, the Bishop may reappear strongly at h5 or b3. And it covers c2, freeing Ne3 from that chore.

21 ..... d5

To cover c4. Necessarily? See note to move 14.

22 Nh1!

This is wonderful stuff to watch. Just a pity I'm playing Black!





Not exactly what I had in mind when I played 5 Nh3. The main reason for Nh1 is to clear the Queen's way to h4. 22 Nh3 would do that too, but where does the Knight go from there? If I play g6 he will likely reply ... h6, keeping things closed and denying my Knight g5. Since my more likely Pawn push is h6, I envision Nh1-g3-h5.

22 ..... Qf7  
23 c3

Clearing c2 and so threatening Na1 and Bc1.

23 ..... Nc6  
24 Rcl

A pity Stephan didn't go for Bc1 and Na1. How could an artist miss THAT?

Important move. Without it he can play ... d4 and answer cxd4 with Nxd4. Then a Black piece could sit on d4 for forever. But after 24 Rcl d4 25 cxd4 Nxd4 his c-pawn would hang. So he would have to re-capture on d4 with the Pawn. I could work around that, and it would be in the way of his pieces.

With his Queen now on f7, I thought about working for g6 with Nh4. But the Knight functions well on e3. It stops ... e5 - 24 ... e5? 25 Nxd5 Qxd5 26 Bb3 +/-

I'm not sure what Black should be going, but his next few moves don't seem right. Perhaps ... Qe7 and ... a3.

24 ..... Rfc8  
25 Rf2 Bf8

How about 25 ... d4 instead? After cxd4 Ncx4 White looks at some combination of Rg2, g6, h6, Qh4, Bh5, Ng3-h5... I like White, but it's unclear.

If he takes with the Bishop - 25 ... d4 26 cxd4 Bxd4 - I was plotting the exchange sac 27 Nc4! Bxf2+ 28 Qxf2. Sound? Who knows? But it's not (yet) a good position for Black Rooks, and here comes h6, Ng3-h5-f6, Qh4, Bh5, g6 ...

26 Rg2

The original one-square-at-a-time attack. At this juncture the game officially ended with 26 ... e5?? 27 Nxd5 1:0. I had been analysing (read "fiddling about") and left my King - unforgivably - on h8. But Stephan was obviously enjoying The Big Squeeze, coz he let me take it back! Who needs sadists with guys like this around?

26 ..... Bd6  
27 Qh4 Qe7  
28 Ng3

Storm clouds have gathered. One likely plan is h6, Nh5-f6, g6. And the game continuation is good against many Black tries, especially the one played.

28 ..... h6



29 Ngxf5

Geronimo.

29 ..... exf5  
30 Nxd5 Qd8  
31 gxb6+ Kh8  
32 Qg3 Resigns

Even the final move is a retreat. 32 ... Qf8 33 Qg7+ Qxg7 34 hxg7+ and 35 Nf6+.

"The losing side had the greater part of his army in positions where they had no bearing whatever upon the questions at issue. They might have been just as well anywhere else on the board."

And I've read the book.

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It is interesting to read about the origins of the Sicilian. It probably dates back to 1617 and featured in the MacDonnell-La Bourdonnais match in 1834 which began 1 e4 c5 2 f4 e6 3 Nf3 d5 4 e5. Modern theory is normally based on preventing Black from playing d5.

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**How to beat your Chess Computer**  
by Raymond Keene & David Levy  
Figurine notation, hardback £9.99

David Levy, who is a Scottish IM and the SCA's International Delegate to FIDE, has been involved with chess computers almost from their inception. For nearly 20 years he was successful in challenge matches against computers until 1989 when he lost 4:0 to Deep Thought. (Are they getting better or was David suffering from anno domini?) There is no doubt that many more commercially available and cheaper chess programs can now give even stronger players a very good game.

Whether the ethics of this book are pure I am not quite sure, as the poor machines cannot counter this attack - or can they!? I have even witnessed players entering into conversations with their computers, just as though they are pets. Sometimes they do have a limited vocabulary such as "I resign" or "would you like another game?"!

There is a useful appendix on what to consider before buying a chess computer.

A West German player from Stuttgart caused a furore in correspondence chess circles earlier in the year when he suggested that the Russians were cheats. He singled out a former World Champion as a culprit in a Soviet attempt to slow down play and give themselves more thinking time. Prior to his playing of a novelty in the opening, a postcard to Moscow had been taking two weeks in the post but as his opponent's position deteriorated, the claimed time in the post became anything up to nine weeks.

The German eventually got fed up with the slow play and offered a draw in a winning position to highlight his "annoyance with," as he claimed, "the fraudulent Russians!"

All Scottish players who play in international tournaments know that you finish the early games against countries with efficient postal systems such as Scandinavia, Germany and Holland, and the games which linger are those against the Soviets. It can be argued that the Soviet players often gain by picking off the tournament stragglers who have long ago lost the burst of enthusiasm with which they began the event.



Personally, I doubt if the Russians are cheating. Rather it is simply that the postal system is not up to the quality of their players. If I had a choice I would not play in any event which contained Soviet players since the slow play ruins the tournament.

For example, I have 4 games still going on against them which started in 1987. Currently they have reached move 36 (number of moves in last year 8); move 31 (5); move 37 (10); move 39 (11). An average of less than 9 moves each during 1990 (a 50-move game would take 6 years!)



The first of our games this time should not have suffered from slow play since both players are from the same town. Bernard Milligan writes:

"Being a relative newcomer and only in my second year of correspondence chess, I decided it was about time that I tried my hand at annotating a game.

I am a member of Hawick Chess Club and we have on average 10 members. Both last year and this saw me playing a fellow club mate in the Major Tournament which can't be bad, considering I can play them 52 weeks of the year!

I have decided to annotate one of my games against Alan Armstrong and I am sure he will forgive me for choosing this one since in the other game I played a move which can only be described as a tactical blunder, which allowed Alan to dictate just about every move thereafter. This shows that even in correspondence chess you can play a move that you will probably regret for the rest of your life. Anyway, on with the game and I hope you enjoy it."

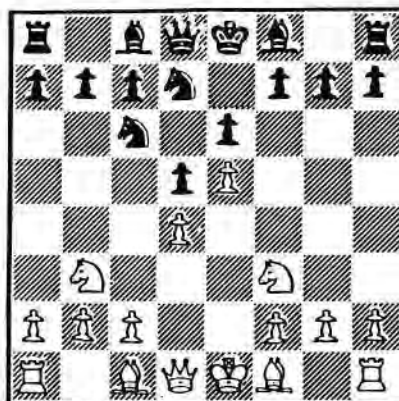

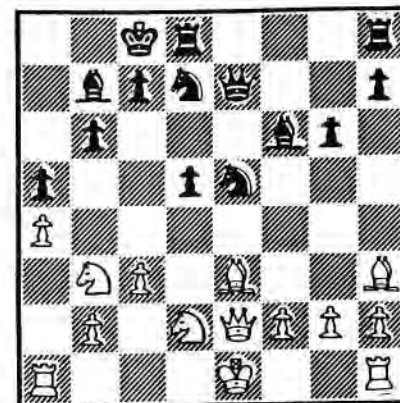

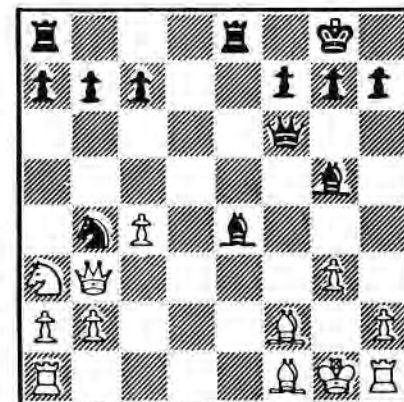

Charles Warburton used to run the Games Column in the BCCA's Correspondence Chess magazine. He had very decided tastes in the opening. He disliked any fianchetto openings and enthused about his beloved Ruy Lopez. He claimed that 3 ... a6 was not the correct defence, preferring 3 ... Nf6.

Most of the GMs have never heard of C. Warburton but isn't he absolutely correct. How on earth do you explain 3 ... a6 to a beginner; it neither develops a piece nor defends the attacked e-pawn.

Raymond Burrige's opponent doesn't make a very good advert for one of the "solid" alternatives.

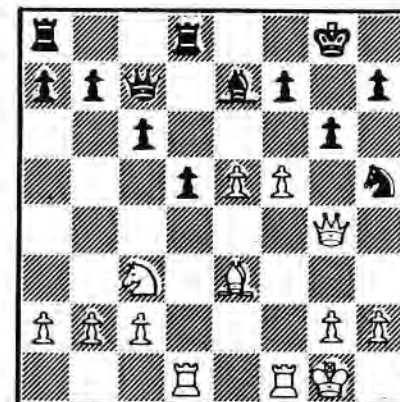

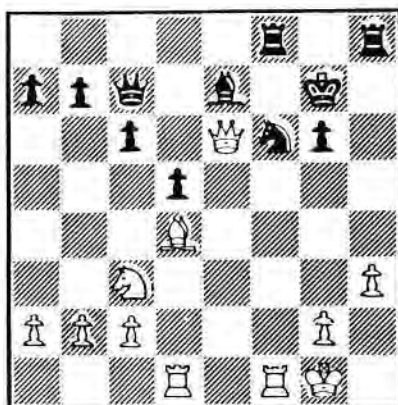

## Keeping an "open" mind about 1. e4

(by David Kilgour)

Alan Borwell asked me to write an article for the magazine on any chess subject of interest to readers. I decided to write the following article based on my choice of opening system against 1. e4.

The story starts some fifteen years ago when I was a Fischer fan and played the Najdorf, relishing the prospect of an exciting game, but also hoping to "out-book" my opponent with my many prepared lines. Usually at that time if I did not get an advantage from the opening, I would lose the ending as I knew nothing about rook endings, or any other ending for that matter.

Ten years ago, it looked very likely that Fischer would not return to chess and the Najdorf had been suffering at the hands of Karpov and the after-effect of the Fischer-Spassky match, and I decided that I would play the French Defence mainly because Kortchnoi played it and had some good results with it.

For eight years I always played the French as Black against 1. e4, only varying when I thought that my opponent might have prepared something new to unleash against me.

I played the French in my correspondence games and did quite well until about five years ago. When I reviewed my results at correspondence chess for the previous five years, I discovered that my French had let me down on quite a few occasions, especially against good opposition, eg. Zapletal in the last Olympiad I defended for 56 moves to obtain a draw.

I decided that White too often played by the book and gained an advantage which could be nullified by Black but at the cost of only obtaining a draw, which was not good enough if you had to achieve 75% of the points to get an IM norm.

At this point I decided to try new openings as Black against 1. e4. First the Sicilian - Pelikan, then Scheveningen, next the Alekhine, even the Caro-Kann, but I was not really happy with the positions I got from these openings.

About this time I started play in the Horowitz correspondence tournament and played an Alekhine, a Najdorf and 1 ... e5 just for a change. My first thought was to play the Marshall in this game but I decided that the Open Ruy was worth a try and played the game below against Kubach. Here was an opening that gave Black a solid position with some hope of an advantage at a later stage, especially in the ending; also Kortchnoi played it - a recommendation?!

I discovered that there were not too many books on the Open Ruy and only a few well-known GMs played it so I looked through my last year (or two)'s chess magazines to see if I could find any games, especially annotated ones as these would give me a rough idea of what Black's objectives are and what type of positions are favourable and unfavourable for each side.

The games below relate to my search for the variation played by Kubach but in total I had 200 games on the Open to look at.

I think all players should decide what openings they play by trying each one at least once in actual play and getting a broad idea of what the themes of each opening are, rather than just follow the openings of your hero as his style may be different from yours and while he gets results with a particular opening, mere mortals often find that they do not. Also by only following book lines, you might lose track of the opening theory and the type of middle and endgames that the opening could lead to. Remember there are three stages to most chess games - opening, middle game and ending.

David Kilgour must have the best chance, having so far virtually scored all of the seven points required. However, David is still not over-optimistic, having a number of poor/unclear positions in his remaining games. David is also doing well in his World #-Final, from which he annotates the following game.

Aware of the status of the tourney, and the unique opportunity it offered, I resolved to give it my "best shot". In the past, I've spoiled too many games with hasty, thoughtless moves (probably lacking the necessary self-discipline to succeed at a high level) - thus I decided to give all 14 games my undivided attention! Other games in progress have suffered accordingly!

My new strategy soon reaped dividends with a win over Iain Campbell - for me a satisfying game to open my account - Iain had beaten me rather easily in the 1989-91 Championship in the same opening line.

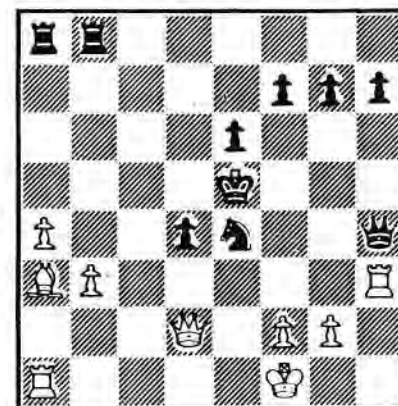

George continues, "Shortly thereafter, I missed an excellent opportunity against Brian Martin. As White, I reached the following position after Brian's 26th (Nc3-e4).

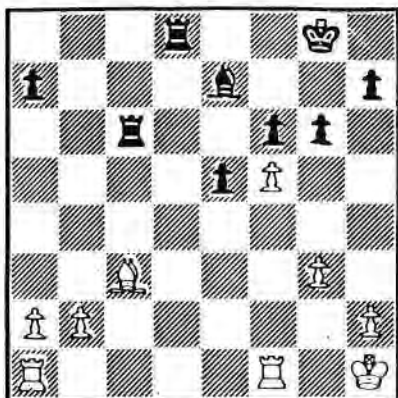


Here I missed the crushing 27 Bd6+!! Kd5 (the bishop is untouchable!) 28 Qxd4+!! Kxd4 29 Rd1+ Nd2 30 Rxd2+ Ke4 31 Rxh4+ winning easily. Instead, after 27 Re1 Kd5 28 Qe2 Qxf2+! 29 Qxf2 Nxf2 30 Kxf2 g5, I soon had to settle for a draw.

However, a lucky win over Roger Patterson (CA) following his unfortunate clerical error offset the lost half-point. Thereafter a series of draws was followed early in July 1991 by a third win over Kari Koistenen (SF).



The magic score (+5) seemed tantalisingly close! Then disaster struck! Against Peter Wagg (AUS), in the following position, I produced an awful blunder:



Playing Black, I should hold a draw despite White's small advantage. Any B+P ending would likely be good for White with the possibility of passed pawns on both wings but any R+P ending should be OK for Black. Anyway, it all became academic after 27 ... Rc7??? 28 Ba5. My worst ever CC blunder! (although I've made worse OTB!)

Following the loss to Wagg, I presently (23/7/91) have 6/10 (+3 = 6-1). A seventh draw seems inevitable so the magic score of 9½/14 now seems sadly out of reach. Still, I'm enjoying the Tourney!

Also chasing the IM title is our President, Alan Borwell.

In the European Team Championship, Alan has scored 3/6 with good prospects of full points in his remaining 2 games. The %IM norm is 5½ pts, so he is likely to fall short by only ½ point. He tells me that he had an overwhelming position against his Austrian opponent. Unfortunately he not only let the win slip from his grasp but also then allowed his opponent to gain the full point which, ironically, secured the IM title for Dr. Teichmeister!

In Section A of the Scottish Invitation event, Alan thinks he could reach a total near to the IM norm. He handicapped himself with oversights against Chandler and Prystenski. He is the exchange up in two of his remaining games and a pawn up in another.

Now he has retired from full-time employment, Alan is hoping that the availability of more "quality thinking time" will help him to achieve an ICCF title!

1 d4 c5!? A43

"A move of little independent significance which can only be played by players willing to allow transposition to the Sicilian Defence." At least that is what I thought of this opening until it occurred in my correspondence games. The value of c5 is certainly in its transpositional qualities and it gives Black a wide range of choices. A comprehensive survey of these would take a whole book and so I will restrict myself to one playable system.

I will not consider e3, c3 or dxc5 as second moves for White because they offer nothing except the possibility of boring Black to death. Similarly 2 Nf3 cxd4 3 Nxd4 d5 followed by 4 ... e5 gives easy equality. This leaves us with the two main lines.

Line 1: 2 d5 Nf6

1A 3 c4 allows Black the choice of Benoni systems or the King's Indian. The point of having played c5 on move 1 is that White has been unable to steer the game into quiet positional waters by the move order 1 d4 Nf6 2 c4 c5 3 Nf3.

1B 3 Nc3 d6 (e6 is also possible) 4 Nf3 g6 5 e4 Bg7 6 Be2 0-0 7 0-0 Na6 8 h3 Nc7 9 a4 b6 10 Bf4 a6 11 Re1 Bb7 12 Bc4 after which Qd7 gives equal chances (De Mauro-Giulian, USA v Scotland). This system had been under a cloud for some time, especially after Korchnoi lost a vital game to Karpov. Recently, Torre has adopted this opening regularly as Black with excellent results.


Line 2

2 e4 cxd4 3 Nf3 (3 c3 d5 transposes to the c3 Sicilian) 3 ... Qa5+!?



In this position, David Kilgour (later!!) suggested 4 c3 with attacking chances but I'm not convinced by 4 c3 Nf6 5 e5 dxc3 6 Nxc3 Ne4.

So from the diagrammed position, I continued with 4 Bd2 Qb6 5 Na3 Nc6 6 Nc4?! Qc7 7 Bd3 b5 8 Na3 a6 9 0-0 e6 10 Nb1 (Giulian-Stewart, 3rd NATT) and Black is better. Having got this far, I wish I'd tried 4 c3 but it seems to me 3 ... Qa5+ at least equalises.

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## INTERNATIONAL REPORT

(by Philip Giulian)

Scotland has been accepted as a full member of ICCF. Effectively this means that we now enjoy the same status in correspondence chess that Scotland does for over-the-board chess, football, rugby, etc. This is excellent news, not just in nationalistic terms, but it gives us full control over our own affairs. Your Committee has a multitude of issues to consider and in the next issue of our magazine, we will give a full report on how we intend to proceed.

As well as bringing back details of our full membership, Alan Borwell returned from the ICCF Congress with an excellent report on our Olympiad chances. News from Argentina is that they are very unlikely to produce the high plus score needed from their large number of uncompleted games. With Portugal also not likely to catch up, it is looking increasingly likely that Scotland will finish in third place. Czechoslovakia are leading the Final and this means that we are now strong favourites to qualify for the next Final (along with Hungary).

After five years of play, our "friendly" international with the Ukraine has ended. This has been a much longer match than usual but there have been some problems with the post. The result was a resounding 27:11 victory for the Ukraine, with two games abandoned.

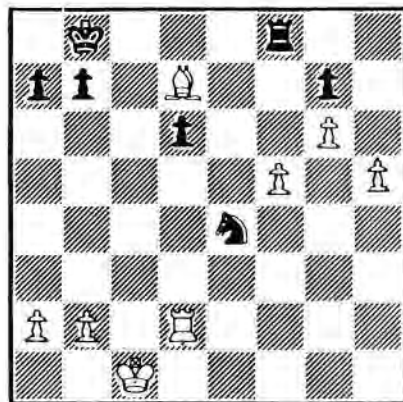
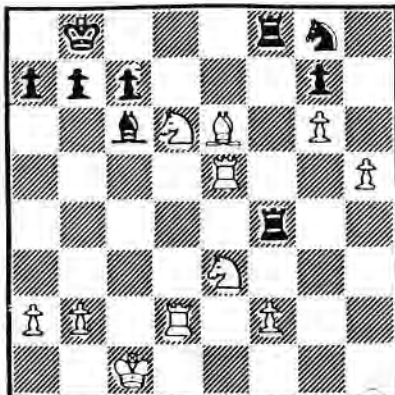

## READERS' LETTERS

Two interesting letters were received from David Salter (Ilkley):

"I've noticed from the tournament tables that some players have found themselves in categories too high for their level of play. It seems to me that there would be fewer dispiriting scorelines of 25% or under if a promotion system was implemented throughout the all-play-all encounters.

Perhaps the introduction of a MINOR is required for those who clearly struggled in the previous season's MAJOR and the stipulation that PREMIER players earn their places by promotion from MAJOR or through good results elsewhere. I think some optimistic souls are going into the strong tournaments when they'd do better to go one division lower.

The date for beginning a new season is something that has also prompted me to write. Currently play gets off to a start in mid-November virtually stops in December due to Christmas holidays, postal delays etc, then resumes shakily after the New Year spirit! Would a mid-January start date perhaps find favour?"

David also writes: "The ICCF rules regarding time controls would undoubtedly benefit from Allan Hislop's proposals [see Mag 36] though I should be inclined to go one step further and abolish the 'second chance' arrangement altogether.

Already we see SCCA 1-year tournaments in which overstepping the limit brings about an immediate forfeit. Moreover players are generally successful in adhering to this rule with thinking time that is only two-thirds of the ICCF limit. If the 'ten-in-twenty' competitors can manage this then I don't see why the 'ten-in-thirty' players cannot do the same.

Allan's points about the conditional moves also have my support. When presented with a reasonable looking sequence, one may accept it rather than spend significant time analysing all the way through. This, of course, may be part of the opponent's plan to avoid some tricky phase of the game in which some less desirable sequence occurs! Chess is fundamentally a game of taking turns so the idea of having the moves almost played for you is not to be encouraged."

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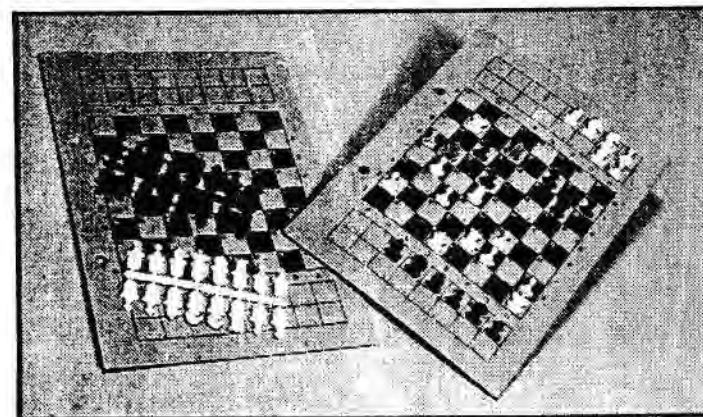
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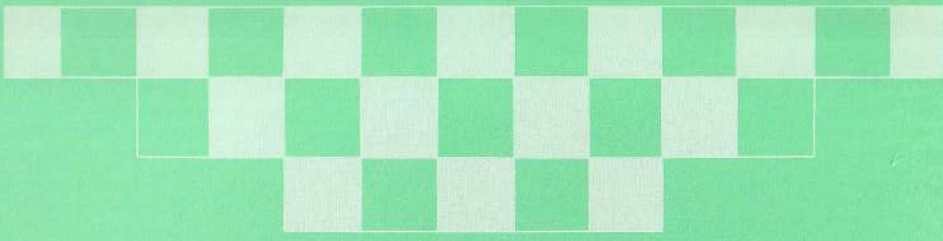
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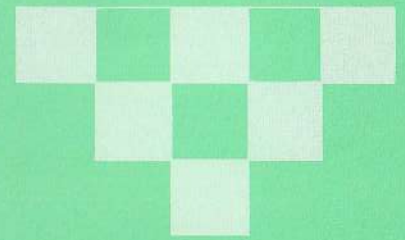
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
